

## "How do I know if the grant I am considering is right for my organization's needs?"

In order to find a solid fit, ideally, you want "yes" to be the answer to each of the questions below. In order to apply and have your application considered, you <u>must</u> be able to answer "yes" to the questions below that have been marked with an asterisk.

- 1. Do the program's purposes and objectives closely match your short- and/or long-term goals?\*
- 2. Is your organization type an eligible applicant for the grant program?\*
- 3. If the program's eligibility is limited to a specific or a set of specific geographic area(s), is your organization located within the stated area?\*
- 4. Has the grant program ever funded a project like yours in the past?
- 5. Is the program aimed at serving the population you work with and desire funding for?
- 6. Is the award amount enough for you to accomplish all or a distinct part of your goals?
- 7. Are your budget needs "allowable costs" under the program?\*
- 8. Will the awards be made and the money become accessible when you need it?
- 9. Is the length of the award period appropriate for your needs?
- 10. If there is a match requirement, is your organization willing and able to meet it?\*
- 11. Are you and is your organization willing to comply with all programmatic requirements discussed in the grant guidance?\*
- 12. Does your idea represent a novel solution based on proven methods?
- 13. If partnerships are required or strongly suggested, does your organization have appropriate relationships in place or is your organization willing to build appropriate relationships in order to respond to that requirement, *and* can you get letters from the necessary partners demonstrating their commitment by describing the role they will play?\*
- 14. If the program requires a prior connection to the funder or its affiliate(s), does your organization have the necessary connection?\*
- 15. Has your organization's authorized official agreed to allow you to pursue the grant?\*
- 16. Can you create and submit a strong, complete proposal by the application deadline?\*
