Varsity Letter Requirements







Cherokee County Special Olympics is committed to the highest ideals of sport and expects all coaches and athletes to honor sports and Special Olympics. To be eligible to receive a varsity letter, Special Olympics athletes must participate in a Special Olympics sport for a minimum of two seasons while in high school and exhibit the following:

Sportsmanship

- Practice positive sports behaviors
- Respect other athletes, coaches, and officials
- Refrain from using bad language
- Refrain from insulting other persons
- Refrain from fighting with other athletes, coaches, volunteers or staff

Training and Competition

- Attend practices and competitions
- Learn and follow the rules of the sport
- Obey and respect coaches and game officials
- Participate to best ability while training, divisioning, and competing

Personal Responsibilities

- Refrain from making inappropriate or unwanted physical, verbal or sexual advances on others
- Refrain from using alcohol, smoking or taking illegal drugs while representing Cherokee County Special
 Olympics at training sessions, competition or during Games
- Refrain from taking drugs for the purpose of improving performance
- Obey all laws and Cherokee County Special Olympics rules

Varsity letters are presented to eligible athletes during the Special Olympics sports banquet.
