





Parent and teen cell phone ownership over time







Q3, 2010 vs. Q3, 2011



#### Half of 12-Year-Olds are on Facebook

Social networks like Facebook and MySpace are supposed to be limited to people who are ages 13 and up, but this is far from being the case, according to the Pew Internet & American Life Project, which found that nearly half of American 12-year-olds -- 45% -- have profiles on these sites. Assuming the 12-year-old population has remained stable, around 3.96 million since the latest Census projections in 2009, that means 1.78 million 12-year-olds are evading Facebook's age limits.

These figures, while large, don't come as much of a surprise following an earlier estimate from Consumer Reports that 7.5 million children under the age of 13 are on Facebook, including five million children under the age of 10. And they're in line with separate data from Harris Interactive, which found that half of

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
parents with 12-year-olds know that their children are on Facebook. What's more, seven out of ten of these parents actually actively helped their children evade the security protocols meant to prevent anyone from under age 13 getting on the site.

Meanwhile it seems that social media use correlates with a tendency to falsify age data in other areas of online activity: Pew found that 49% of teens who use social networks admitted to misrepresenting their age to gain access to Web sites and online services, compared to 26% of teens who don't use social networks.

Again, this isn't terribly surprising in light of an earlier Pew survey, from 2007, showing that 69% of younger teens deliberately post false information on their social media profiles, compared with 48% of older teens. Meanwhile 64% of male teens said they post false information on their profiles, compared to 50% of female teens.





The woman linked to a fake My Space profile of a 16-year-old boy created to start an Internet relationship with Megan Meier, the Missouri teen who hanged herself after receiving hurtful messages, is now believed to be the victim of a cyber-bullying impersonator herself.

And the online harassment laws that were passed after Meier's death last year now may be used to help the middle-aged woman, who many believe was responsible for the 13year-old girl's suicide.

On Dec. 3, a blog entitled "Megan Had It Coming" carried an entry signed by Lori Drew, the woman involved in creating the fictitious profile that taunted Meier. The blog entry appeared on the same day St. Charles County Prosecutor Jack Banas announced there wasn't enough evidence to charge anyone in connection with Meier's death.

"It's time I dropped the charade. Yes, I made this blog. Yes, I'm Lori Drew," the blogger wrote.

The posting, which recounts in chilling detail the entire Megan Meier incident, mentions Drew's





## Facebook throws potentially suicidal users a Lifeline

**Summary:** Facebook teams up with the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline to offer help to people who are thinking of taking their lives and a referral option for people who worry about a friend in distress.



Facebook announced today that it's working with the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline on a program designed to help save lives.

The new service will enable Facebook users to click on a link and be taken to a page where they can enter into a live chat with a suicide prevention specialist. There is also a reporting link where users can alert Facebook, if they see something on a person's profile that causes them to think that the person is in severe distress. Facebook will send a message to that person to encourage them to contact the Lifeline.

The company isn't using technology or people to look for suicidal posts. It is relying on users to reach out. In the past, Facebook would contact the Lifeline with the name, e-mail address, and city of anyone who had been reported as potentially suicidal, but with this new system, the communication goes only to the person in distress, according to Lidia Bernik, associate project director of the Lifeline (scroll down for the full podcast interview)


