Olympic Charter and International Canoe Federation (ICF) Statutes

Olympic Charter:

"<u>The practice of sport is a **human** right</u>. Every individual must have the possibility of practicing sport, <u>without discrimination</u> of any kind and in the Olympic spirit."

ICF Statutes ARTICLE 2 – PURPOSE


1. The principles of the ICF shall be general unity of action, mutual respect of National Federations in their dealings with one another <u>and the</u> <u>inadmissibility of discrimination</u>... <u>Paddling is competitive and</u> <u>recreational activity for all, regardless of race, age, gender, religion or ability</u>.





What Factors are Contributing to the Exclusion of Women's Canoe from the Olympics?

ICF continues to state Women's Canoe "needs more development"
 – specifically, Sprint Canoe needs more development but Slalom is Ready for Rio.



International Canoe Federation Position Statement


"The ICF would like to point out that on a global scale, few National Federations are developing the Women's Canoe category in the Sprint discipline whereas much progress is being made in the development of the Women's Canoe category in Slalom...

... the ICF is now committed to having a Women's Canoe Singles event (Canoe Slalom) included in the Sport Programme of the Rio 2016 Olympic Games."

- 1. ICF continues to state Women's Canoe "needs more development."
- 2. IOC Quotas on athlete and event slots.
- 3. Adding women's events costs money and time.

Why is voting still required on things that are stated core values in statutes and charters?




International Canoe Federation Position Statement




Sprint Olympic Events & Women's Canoe at the 2010 World Championships

Para-Canoe/Kayak added to Rio 2016 in 2010


The process to include Para-canoe/kayak into the 2016 Summer Paralympics began 1 October 2009, less than 2 months after exhibition events in August 2009.

Within 9 months, approval was reached 16 July 2010.

Official announcement of Olympic status made by the International Paralympic Committee and the ICF December 2010.




2009 Sprint World Championships Exhibition Events for Para-canoe/kayak & Women's Canoe

WHAT WE WANT

Balance Between the Genders and Disciplines (Canoe/Kayak) by 2020

- 1. 2014 World Championships/World Cups women's events equal to men
- 2. 2015 allow Toronto (host organizing committee) to add C2 sprint to the Pan American Games to match current Worlds status
- 3. 2016 Rio Olympics women's canoe Sprint & Slalom
- 4. 2018 Youth Olympic Games women's events equal to men
- 5. 2019 Pan American Games women's events equal to men
- 6. 2020 Olympics women's events equal to men

3. Recommend to the ICF to add gender equality to their list of priorities.

Asked for his main priorities as ICF president for the next four-year cycle, Mr. Jose Perurena stated:

"To maintain the image and reputation of canoeing and the ICF...

Then to ensure canoeing is on TV and in the media around the world in the leadup to Rio and beyond.

Then, importantly, it's my job to support our teams and athletes at the events because that is what we are doing all this work for."

- 1. Petition the IOC to "Get Equal Before Adding" increase the caps.
- 2. Petition the IOC to conduct an Olympic Program review to determine what is the "magic number" of athletes which will truly represent the best in the world. Why 10,500 and not 12,000?
- 3. Recommend to the ICF to add gender equality to their list of priorities.
- 4. Create an external Olympic accountability arm for gender equality similar to World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).
- 5. Keep these continued gender imbalances in your conversations about the Olympics, and participate in discussions for resolution.


