Hear the children of Pam Laffin, a 31-year-old mother on a lung machine, as they endure the painful ordeal of watching her die of lung cancer.

"LegalEASE: The Legal Ramifications of Alcohol Abuse"

This program focuses on some of the legal consequences of alcohol use and abuse. It addresses issues such as alcoholism, deaths and injuries resulting from impaired driving, rape and sexual assaults, family violence and child abuse (including the effects of prenatal alcohol use on an unborn child). Also covered are some of the legal repercussions suffered by those who engage in destructive behaviors causing harm to themselves or others.

"Inhalants for Middle Schools"

This realistic program shows that inhalants are not even considered to be drugs, but rather deadly poisons. Viewers will hear the personal stories of ex-users who explain why they started, why they stopped and why students should never even try it. You will hear a young doctor explain what is actually happening inside the body to the lungs, heart, kidneys, liver and the brain as computer animation shows in graphic detail how brain cells die. - 6. Watch the United Streaming video, <u>"LegalEASE: Program Two: The Legal Ramifications of Drug Abuse"</u> and complete guide. 10 points
- 7. List 10 ways to discourage teens from starting to smoke. 10 points
- 8. Write a letter to the editor explaining the short and long-term effects of tobacco abuse. 10 points
- 9. Find a story online, in a magazine, or newspaper that details how someone's life was "short-lived" from tobacco, alcohol, or drug abuse. 10 points
- 10. List 10 reasons why teens should NOT drink alcohol and explain why. 10 points
- 11. Create a list of ten illicit (illegal) drugs and describe them. 10 points
- 12. Watch the Sam Spady video and complete guide (THIS WILL BE DONE IN CLASS) 10 points
- 13. Find $\underline{5}$ tobacco or alcohol advertisements. (ads may be found in magazines newspaper, or online) Explain how these advertisements are attractive to teenagers. 10 points
- 14. Make a list of things you are addicted to (talking on the cell phone, the computer, instant messaging, shopping, exercise, chewing gum, etc...) choose one of those "addictions" and make an attempt to refrain from that activity or thing for 24 hours. Write a summary on how you did. Were you successful? Why or Why not? Was it difficult? What did you learn about this

- experience? Did you have a strong support team (friends, family, etc...) that helped you or did they hinder you? 10 points
- 15. Create a Wordle (<u>www.wordle.net</u>) with at least 100 words associated with substance abuse and Unit 2. 10 points
- 16. Create a Venn Diagram comparing and contrasting tobacco and smokeless tobacco. 10 points
- 17. Give 10 suggestions on how to make your teen safe from using prescription drugs. 10 points

7. Create a Jeopardy style game with 3 topics (alcohol, tobacco, drugs) and 5 questions for each topic for a total of 15 questions. (see below) 20 points

- 9. Write a "Life's Little Instruction Book" (at least 10 pages) with illustrations for teens to remain drug free! 20 points
- 10. Create a children's book (at least 10 pages) with illustrations that explains the dangers of tobacco, drugs or alcohol. 20 points
- 11. Present a talk show (no more than groups of 4) to present to the class on the dangers of substance or drug abuse. 25 points

12. Write and perform a news broadcast on the dangers of drinking and driving. 25 points 13. Create an ABOVE THE INFLUENCE commercial 25 points 14. Create an animoto (www.animoto.com) on drugs, alcohol, or tobacco. 25 points EVALUATING/ANAYLZING CONTENT (maximum 50 points) RED REFFER TO RED LAYER SCOCRING RUBRIC-- Write a detailed response paper explaining your belief and support it with research.
