- A philanthropist whose openhearted generosity continues to touch the lives of thousands








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A Legacy of Corporate Social Responsibility

- Hershey left his fortune to the School, which has been in existence for more than 100 years.
- Controlling interest of The Hershey Company is held by the Hershey Trust which funds the School.
- Today, the Milton Hershey School, serves 1,800 children from across the country, providing a home, food, clothing, medical care, and a quality education at no cost.

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Physical Activity During School

Provide additional opportunities to practice the skills they learned in physical education class.

- •Recess stations (during lunch period for secondary level)
- •Physical activity breaks during class time.
- •SCHOOL-WIDE FIELD DAY as a local HTFG event





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Physical Activity Before and After School

Organize **BEFORE or AFTER SCHOOL** programs to reinforce run, jump and throw skills taught in PE class.

- Run, Jump & Throw Clubs
- **Intramural Track Clubs**



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Staff Involvement

Enlist the help of school staff members

- Equip classroom teachers with Run, Jump & Throw classroom activity break ideas
- Staff can provide supervision and support during a culminating HTFG event





Family and Community Involvement

- Include families in HTFG meets as event volunteers (judges, scorers, supporters, drink station)
- Work with the community recreation department to host an HTFG event together
- Engage community service volunteers (Track clubs, Key Club, Kiwanis, etc)

- The oldest and largest service organization for teens (high school students age 14–18)
- Part of a family of programs of Kiwanis International
- Support Kiwanis mission to serve children of the world by performing acts of service in their communities


